- 1.3. Bidders may not seek or obtain the assistance of employees CHIETA in the preparation of their proposal's responses.

2. PAYMENT

- 2.1. CHIETA will pay the Contractor the fees set out in the final contract according to the table of deliverables. No additional amounts will be payable by the CHIETA to the Contractor.

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- 2.2.** The Contractor shall from time to time during the duration of the contract, invoice CHIETA for the services rendered.
- 2.3.** The invoice must be accompanied by supporting source document(s) containing detailed information, as CHIETA may require, for the purposes of establishing the specific nature, extent and quality of the services which were undertaken by the Contractor.
- 2.4.** No payment will be made to the Contractor unless an original tax invoice complying with section 20 of the VAT Act No 89 of 1991, as amended, has been submitted to CHIETA.
- 2.5.** Payment shall be made by bank transfer into the Contractor's back account normally 30 days after receipt of an acceptable, original, valid tax invoice. 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1. INTRODUCTION

The CHIETA is an entity of government and subscribes to the principles of good corporate governance, which requires conducting business in an honest and transparent manner in line with the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA). In line with the above, CHIETA has adopted various policies whose objective is to achieve sound financial management, to strengthen a culture of honesty, reliability, transparency, and care amongst all its internal and external stakeholders. 2. PROJECT BACKGROUND AND THE NEED

The Chemical Industries Education & Training Authority (CHIETA) seeks to appoint a qualified and experienced service provider to deliver training for newly appointed Chamber Chairpersons. The training is aimed at equipping them with the knowledge, skills, and confidence to effectively lead chamber meetings and fulfil governance responsibilities.

The chambers are structures which consult with the 9 sub-sectors of the chemical industry in areas of Skills Development and planning. The objective of such consultation is to compile a sector skills plan for the sector that takes into consideration areas of skills demand, skills supply, scarce and critical skills, strategic plan, and other relevant skills planning activities.

The nine sub-sectors that make-up the Chemical Industries Sector are grouped in the following five Chambers:

- Base Chemicals and Petroleum
- Speciality Chemicals and Surface Coatings
- Explosives and Fertilizers
- Pharmaceuticals and Fast-Moving Consumer Goods
- Glass

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Each chamber has a chairperson who must ensure that the chamber meeting is effective, and the chamber performs its functions effectively, through full participation during meetings, and that all relevant matters are discussed, and effective decisions are made and carried out.

3. PURPOSE OF THE TRAINING

The purpose of the training is to:

- Build foundational chairing skills for first-time chairpersons.
- Equips chairpersons with the skills to lead meetings and facilitate consensus-driven decision-making.
- Strengthen understanding of governance, roles, and responsibilities.
- Enhance confidence in managing relationships with diverse stakeholders (labour, employer, government)
- Promote effective, fair, and compliant meeting processes.
- Strengthens their ability to oversee agendas, track action items, and ensure chambers deliver measurable outcomes.

4. SCOPE AND REQUIREMENTS

The appointed facilitator will be required to:

- Design and deliver a structured training programme (in-person or virtual)
- Customise content to align with SETA/chamber governance frameworks, leadership, and stakeholder engagement.
- Facilitate interactive sessions including:
 - Role-playing
 - Case studies
 - Practical simulations of meetings (including balancing diverse interests and fostering inclusive participation)
 - Provide training materials (slides, guides, templates)

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- Develop a Chairperson Toolkit (agenda templates, meeting protocols, etc.)
- Conduct pre- and post-assessments (if required)
- Submit a training report with attendance, feedback, and recommendation.
- Training is expected to take place in the month of June 2026. This should be a 2-day training delivered via Microsoft Teams.

By the end of this training, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate a clear understanding of the role and responsibilities of a chairperson
- Plan and manage effective meetings.
- Apply governance and compliance principles.
- Chair meetings with confidence.
- Engage and manage diverse stakeholders.
- Handle conflict and differing views constructively.
- Facilitate discussions and support decision-making.
- Use standard meeting tools and templates effectively.
- Demonstrate ethical leadership and impartiality.
- Lead structured and outcome-driven meeting.

5. EVALUATION AND SELECTION CRITERIA

The CHIETA has set minimum standards (Gates) that bidders must meet to be considered. All quotations duly lodged as specified in the Request for Quotation will be examined to determine compliance with quotation requirements and conditions. Quotations with obvious deviations from the requirements/conditions will be eliminated from further consideration.

Below criteria will be used to assess individual bidders' proposals.

CHIETA will conduct screening of mandatory documents to check whether bidders fully meet compliance requirements. Bidders are required to complete and provide all mandatory documents stipulated below. Non submission will lead to bidders' proposals being disqualified.

- Duly completed and signed standard bidding document (SBD1)
- Duly completed and signed standard bidding document (SBD4) and
- Where bidders wish to claim Preference points, bidders are required to provide valid BBEE certificate and/or Sworn affidavit.

5.2. GATE 2 - TECHNICAL ASSESSMENT

The facilitator must have:

- A relevant qualification in:
 - Governance, Public Administration, HR, Law, or related field
- Minimum 5 years' experience in:
 - Facilitation and training delivery
 - Governance or board/chairperson development
- Proven experience working with SETAs, public sector, or similar stakeholder environments.
- Strong understanding of South African governance frameworks and stakeholder engagement (labour/employer structures)
- The service provider must be accredited with the Services SETA or ETDP SETA

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5.3. GATE 3: PRICE AND PREFERENCE

5.3.1. The bidders that have successfully progressed through to Gate 1 & 2 will be evaluated in accordance with the **80/20** Preference Point System as contemplated in the Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022.

5.3.2. The point scored for the B-BBEE status level certificate for each acceptable quotation will now be added to the price point.

5.3.3. The point scored for the B-BBEE status level certificate for each acceptable quotation will now be added to the price point.

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- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

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fraudulent basis, be restricted from obtaining business from any organ of state for a period not exceeding 10 years, after the *audi alteram partem* (hear the other side) rule has been applied; and

- (e) forward the matter for criminal prosecution, if deemed necessary.
